





# ALLEN TAN & THE HABITAT PENANG HILL-THE STORY SO FAR

Allen Tan, Managing Director, The Habitat Penang Hill & Member, Executive Committee of The Habitat Foundation is a lawyer by training with a family background in construction and property development, Allen never expected to find himself working in the tourism sector upon his return to Penang, let alone in an ecotourism company with a mission to conserve, educate and inspire people to care for the environment. Since The Habitat Penang Hill eco-park first opened on 8th January 2016, its mission has been to raise awareness among its visitors about the importance of our shared natural heritage. They do this by creating and curating opportunities for people to experience and reconnect with nature when visiting the park.

Further to this mission, The Habitat has been heavily involved in supporting the Penang State and Malaysian Governments' application to nominate Penang Hill and its surrounding areas as a UNESCO Biosphere Reserve under the Man and the Biosphere (MAB) Programme. Biosphere Reserves are learning places for sustainable development that promote solutions reconciling the conservation of biodiversity with its sustainable use. If successful, the Penang Hill Biosphere Reserve, measuring 12,481 hectares in size and comprising both terrestrial and marine ecosystems, will join a World Network of over 700 Biosphere Reserves giving the state an environmental UNESCO recognition to complement its current World Heritage Site status. The initiative was spearheaded by the Penang Hill Corporation (PHC) with the close cooperation and support of The Habitat and other state and federal agencies, including the Penang State Forestry Department (Jabatan Perhutanan), the Department of Wild Life and National Parks (Perhilitan), and the Ministry of Energy and Natural Resources (KeTSA).

Through the work of its sister organisation, The Habitat Foundation, The Habitat supports conservation work in Penang and beyond through a mini grants programme. The founders and shareholders of The Habitat, the Cockrell Family, have pledged all profits generated by the park towards supporting the work of the foundation and have to date already deployed money and resources to support conservation efforts throughout Malaysia and beyond. Allen says that The Habitat organized and funded a biodiversity survey, known as the Penang Hill BioBlitz, in October 2017, the results of which were used to support the application











to UNESCO. The Habitat also funded the consultancy team from Universiti Sains Malaysia (USM) which prepared the submission dossier to support the application. Going forward, The Habitat is working closely with PHC, the School of Biological Sciences, USM and other partners to establish a rainforest research centre on Penang Hill. The goal is to attract scientists from around the world to come to Penang to conduct rainforest research and studies related to environmental conservation and climate change.

Creative economy encompasses an array of sectors including advertising, broadcasting, architecture, arts, crafts, design, fashion, heritage, gastronomy, music, publishing, theatre, technology and etc.

According to UNESCO, the creative economy is "one of the most rapidly growing sectors of the world economy and a highly transformative one in terms of income generation, job creation and export earnings." It is becoming a key force in entrepreneurship and innovation, helping to boost social development and employment.

It is common perception that the agriculture and manufacturing industries are the main economic generators whereas the creative industries are more of leisure than a form of work. However, over the years, it has become significantly clear that creative economy could be a remarkable and profitable industry in its own right.

Penang has taken the initiative to be the first state in Malaysia to introduce "Creative Economy" in the portfolio of a State EXCO, as it sets out to pave the way for economic dynamism on a macro perspective by leveraging on its arts, culture and heritage sectors.

Since George Town was inscribed as a UNESCO World Heritage Site in 2008, urban planners and stakeholders have been studying the feasibility of branding Penang as a "Creative City" to boost and rejuvenate urban development for the State. Penang's assets lie in its exceptional living culture, architecture, multiculturalism and rich collection of historical elements. This is essential to become a sustainable city, which is aligned to the Penang2030 vision.

The concept of "Creative City" was introduced in October 2004 by UNESCO through the launch of The Creative Cities Network to connect cities and share experiences, ideas, and best practices for cultural, social, and economic development. Historical cities equipped with the diversity of cultural resources such as George Town have profound potential to stimulate the development of our creative sectors, and has offered Penang the unique opportunity to transform the conventional tourism industry into a creative tourism industry.

Penang's arts and culture industries have also displayed steady development across the years. Significant events such as George Town Festival and George Town Heritage Celebrations have empowered local communities, nurtured the growth of local talents and opened the eyes of Penangites to international showcases. With its success in hosting world class performances through cross-cultural collaborations and local community engagements, Penang is now well known as one of the most vibrant creative arts and cultural hub in the region.

Penang's outstanding street arts flourishes in tandem with the growth of its arts and culture industries, gaining numerous recognitions over the years such

as the 8th Most Liveable & Workable City in Asia and 2nd best street food in the world. Penang was also listed by The Telegraph as #2 in "Six of the World's Most Thrilling Long Haul City Breaks" and has received mentions from CNN as one of the Best Places to Visit for the Ultimate Asia Experience.

In addition, United Nation has also declared 2021 as the International Year of Creative Economy for Sustainable Development, which recognises the need to promote sustained and inclusive economic growth, foster innovation and provide opportunities, benefits and empowerment for all, as well as respect for all human rights.

The Penang State Government currently strives towards achieving the status of a UNESCO Creative City to realise our vision in positioning Penang as a creative economy hub.

Hence, it is pivotal to educate and initiate public awareness regarding the State's efforts to encourage public participation and promote inclusivity as the duty to develop, promote and implement creative economy does not lie solely in the hands of the authorities.

The synchronized efforts of all parties and active public involvement are core catalysts in ensuring that Penang is one step closer to becoming an economic powerhouse for the nation.

### PENANG SMART PARKING

Running out of parking coupons every time you find a parking spot is the greatest nuisance! To provide a solution to this matter, the Penang Smart Parking (PSP) app was launched by the state council. It is the first of its kind in the country with paper-based coupons unavailable after the 31st of December 2019. This means in 2020 the parking payment in Penang will be fully digital.

This app is a great upgrade to the conventional way of using parking coupons. It eliminates the hassle of searching for parking coupon booths and the time consumed to scratch it when you are rushing for time. You can easily find parking around selected zones, reload your wallet and pay your parking and summon in no time! The Penang Smart Parking app is conveniently downloadable from Google Play and the Apple App Store.

This parking system implements a combination of Internet of Things (IoT), sensor technology, the online payment system and the navigation system. There are 36,000 parking

bays in the state with 24,000 bays under the supervision of the Seberang Perai Municipal Council (SPMC) and 12,000 bays under the Penang City Council (PCC). Smart parking sensors will also be installed to monitor the entry and exit of vehicles.

One of the best features of this app is that it provides users with vacant parking spots based on real-time information. If parking spots in the area are full, the system will provide the user with the closest alternatives available.

The Penang Smart Parking is one of the many initiatives the Penang council has launched to strive towards becoming a smart state. Although it may be hard to adapt to this major change at the beginning, but with time this app holds great potential towards improving the future of Penang's transportation system.


